

# 2006 Lucas Oil Super Comp Association Annual Awards Banquet

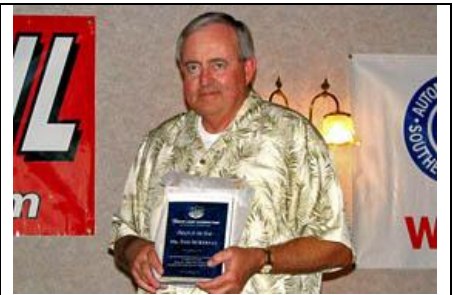

Defending series champ Bobby Dye Jr. ended the year with a win and 8<sup>th</sup> place finish for 2006.



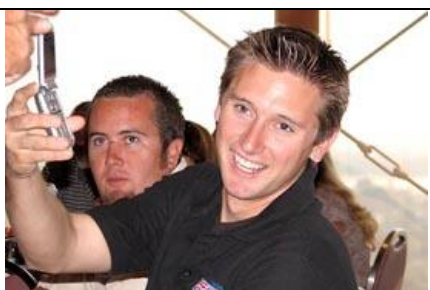
Finishing ninth in the Lucas Super Comp point's standings was Chris McNicol.
