Aguayo wins 2006 Lucas Oil Super Comp Championship & C.L. Bryant Shootout



Aguayo wins Lucas Oil Super Comp Assoc. Championship & Shootout, Momjian, Dye win season-ending races.

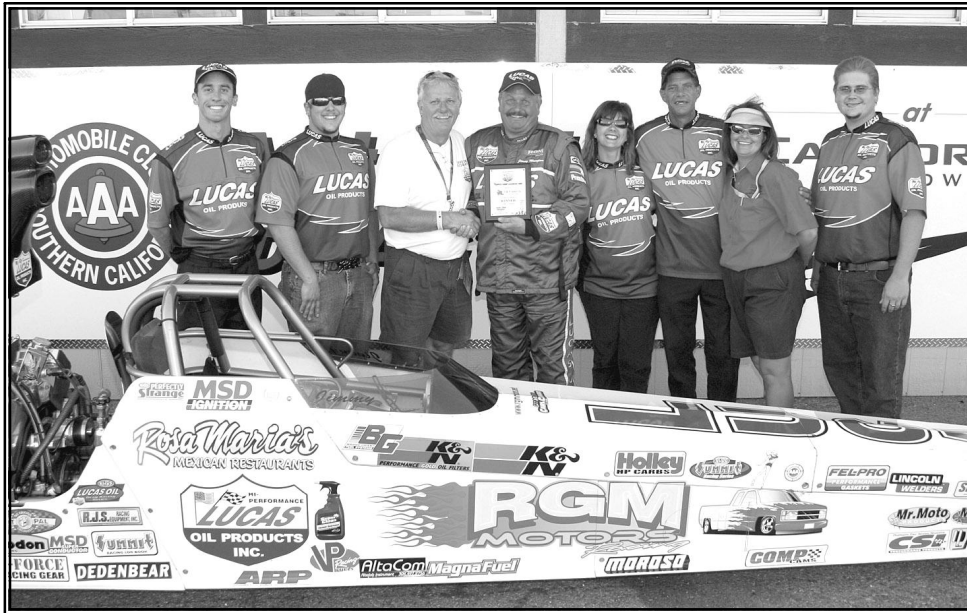

Auto Club Dragway at California Speedway

Fontana, CA Sept 16-17, 2006

Sophomore drag racer Danny Aguayo was in a four-way battle with Danny Fuentes, John Richardson, and Shawn Langdon for the 2006 Lucas Oil Super Comp Assoc., series title, as a mere 15 points separated the four drivers going into the final points-earning race. Fuentes lost in the first round, Richardson lost in the second round, and Langdon didn't make the race because of national event commitments, and Danny went to the final to put a lock on the series title. He capped the weekend by winning the season ending Shootout when he defeated Sam Boyd in the final round.

Jim Momjian and his RGM Motorsports/Lucas Oil dragster won his second straight series event when he defeated Aguayo in the final round of Saturday's race when Aguayo ran 8.899 on the 8.90 index.

Chris Forsyth led the 45 qualified cars for Saturday's race, clocking an 8.901 for the Perma Coil Racing number one qualifier award. Daniel Oliver was second with an 8.902. Glenn Kirby was third with an 8.912, Joey Trotsky was fourth at 8.913, and Bobby Dye Jr. was fifth with an 8.914

Forsyth opened quarterfinal round eliminations by defeating

Greg Ventura's Nova as Ventura went red by .005, Momjian beat Eddie Fischle in a double breakout race, and Aguayo ran 8.895 to defeat Chris McNicol at 8.882. In the semifinal, Momjian advanced when Forsyth drew a -.005 red light, and Aguayo got a bye run. In the final, Momjian got his second win of the season with a 9.006, 173.94 win as Aguayo was .001 too quick, losing with an 8.899 at 162.70. Sponsors for Momjian include RGM Motors, Rosa Maria's Mexican Restaurants, K & N Filters, and Lucas Oil Products.



Forty-seven cars entered the Sunday non-points race, and for the first time this season three drivers qualified with perfect 8.900 times. Dick Krieger recorded the first perfect time with his '27 Ford, followed by Jim Sowards and Rich Okerman. A total of 13 cars qualified on the 8.90 index.

2005 Lucas Oil Super Comp champion Bobby Dye Jr., went to his first final of the season by defeating Doug Sedmak, Rob Flory, Oliver, and Forsyth before getting a bye into the final round. Larry Madrid went to his second final of the season

when he beat Jeff Derencin, Dave Symons, Dick Krieger, and Ray Medrano before stopping Randy Balough's Corvette in the semifinal, 8.92 to an 8.96.

In the semifinal, Madrid's '96 Brogie dragster advanced with an 8.923, 154.21 (.014 r.t.) to Balough's losing 8.962, 161.09 (.031 r.t.), while Dye ran an 8.876 on his single into the final.

Dye's superior reaction time--.004 to a .070—put him in control of the final round, and he took the win with an 8.930, 165.46 to Madrid's losing 8.842, 163.71. Dye's primary sponsors include Specialty Fasteners and Bonaco Hoses and Fittings.

The 2006 Lucas Oil Super Comp Association racers, sponsors, family and friends will be honored at the annual awards banquet on November 18 at the Pomona Valley Mining Co., 1777 Gillette Road, Pomona, CA 91768. Take Interstate 10 to Fairplex Drive, north on Fairplex (about .1 miles to Gillette, then right on Gillette. Aguayo won the series championship with 465 points, followed by: Danny Fuentes (417); John Richardson (403); Glenn Kirby (402); Shawn Langdon (402); Charlie Waggoner (359); Bobby Dye Jr. (351); Tom McBride (339); Chris McNicol (338); and John Boyd (331).

Aguayo stops Sam Boyd for Super Comp Shootout Title

Danny Aguayo capped his Lucas Oil Super Comp Association series championship weekend with a victory in the annual C.L. Bryant-VP Fuels-Lucas Oil Super Comp Shootout. Aguayo defeated Sam Boyd in the final.

Shannon Chennault led the shootout point's series from the opening weekend of the season until the final qualifying session, where she failed to earn any points for the second straight event. This gave Bobby Dye Jr. the opportunity to advance in the standings, and he moved into the top spot in the final shootout standings with 875 points. Shannon was second with 820, while Aguayo and John Boyd tied for third with 740 points.

In the first round of eliminations, number eight qualifier Chris Forsyth defeated Dye; Aguayo beat Glenn Kirby, Shannon Chennault stopped John Richardson, and Sam Boyd handed his son, John Boyd, a first round loss.

In the semifinals, Aguayo took out Forsyth, and Boyd defeated Chennault. Aguayo made the most of the weekend, as he took advantage of Sam Boyd's -.003 red light and won the prestigious title with an 8.911, 167.01 (.012 reaction time) to Boyd's losing 8.914, 150.38.
