***Danny Aguayo, Danny Fuentes shine at Fontana
with Lucas Oil-Symon's Fire Protection Services Victories-
Fuentes extends Points Lead with second win of season***



Danny Aguayo edges Beckman for Auto Club Dragway win

Danny Aguayo's first Super Comp final came at the Pacific Division event at Chandler, Ariz. earlier this season where he finished runner-up. His first Lucas Oil Super Comp final came at the first race at the newly relocated Auto



Club Dragway at California Speedway, where he beat former national Super Comp champion Jack Beckman for his first win in the class.

Alexis DeJoria led all qualifiers for the Lucas Oil/Symons Fire Protection Services-sponsored event, the third race of the season, running a



Danny Aguayo won his quarterfinal match with Glenn Kirby, winning with an 8.902 (.048 r.t.) to Kirby's losing 8.898 (.023 r.t.). Aguayo then defeated Joe Trotsky in the semi 8.915 to an 8.890.

perfect 8.900 at 179.25. Danny Aguayo and NHRA Jegs All-star champion Shawn Langdon were second with an 8.902. Shannon Chennault continued to add to her Rosa Maria's Top Qualifier points lead by qualifying 4th, and Hubert Pierce was 5th with a 8.907.

Glenn Kirby defeated Rob Symons to open the third round, John Boyd defeated red-lighting Shannon Chennault, and John Cross advanced when Bobby Dye Jr. cut the tree .002 too close, drawing a red-light. Joe Trotsky enjoyed one of

his finest outings when he drove his '37 Fiat dragster past Larry Scarth, Jack Beckman benefited from Shawn Langdon's staging infraction, Jeff Derencin defeated Eric Maass, and Danny Aguayo ran an 8.905 on a bye.

In the quarterfinals, Joey Trotsky defeated John Boyd, Aguayo ran 8.902 to stop Glenn Kirby, Jeff Derencin ran an 8.901 to stop John Cross, and Beckman got a bye. In the semifinal, Beckman defeated Derencin, and Aguayo stopped Trotsky.

Aguayo cut a great .008 light in the final, and ran a winning 8.919, 168.35 with the Symons Fire Protection Services-sponsored dragster, with Tucson divisional race champion Beckman losing with an 8.888, 169.19 (.017 r.t.) with his "Blackbird" dragster.



Jeff Derencin went to his first semifinal round when he defeated John Cross in the quarters, 8.901, 167.05 to a losing 8.896, 144.71. Derencin lost in the semi to "Fast Jack" Beckman, 8.929 to an 8.876.

Danny Fuentes wins second race of season with final round win over John Richardson

Danny Fuentes increased his lead in the Lucas Oil Super Comp Assoc., point's chase when he won his second race of the season. Fuentes won the season-opening event and currently has won two of the four races contested so far this year. Fuentes win came in the Sunday race—co-sponsored by Symons Fire Protection Services—when he defeated John Richardson in the final round.

Qualifying for the Sunday race was led by Bill Smith's PJ Trailer-sponsored dragster, (8.904) and earned the Perma Coil Racing award. Other top qualifiers included: Hubert Pierce (8.905), Shannon Chennault (8.906), Loreen Johnson (8.907), Bobby Dye Jr. (8.908), Danny Aguayo (8.908), Glen Kern (8.909), and Mandy Quigley (8.909).

Fuentes, from nearby Rancho Cucamonga, defeated Jim Monjjan in the third round, he beat John Boyd in



the quarterfinals, and in the semi he cut a .002 light and ran 8.907, 167.22 for the win, defeating Shawn Langdon with a too quick 8.894 and .018 light.

Richardson went to the final by defeating Jeff Murdock in the third round, he beat top qualifier Bill Smith in round four by .002, as he got the win light with an 8.927 (.023 r.t.) to Smith's losing 8.928 (.024 r.t.), and in the semi he stopped the Shake City Express of Charlie Waggoner Jr. in a double breakout race, 8.886, 174.82 (.032 r.t.) as

Charlie lost with an 8.872, 155.06 (.025 r.t.).

In the final round, Fuentes picked up his second win in four races with an 8.903, 164.55 (.003 reaction time), as Richardson's Community Recycling-sponsored dragster picked up another runner-up spot with an 8.895, 176.35 (.034 r.t.).

Fuentes thanks Smiley's Custom Headers, Bonaco Hoses & Fittings, Coast Foundry, Figueroa Motorsports, Awesome Engines, Steve Casner Racing, Munsinger Converters, and his family for all their support.

With the 2006 series continuing at Auto Club Dragway at California Speedway on July 1-2, Fuentes—despite winning two of the four races so far—only holds a narrow 15 point lead over second place Danny Aguayo—274 to 259. Charlie Waggoner is third with 235 points, and Chris McNicol—who was tied for first place before the Fontana weekend, dropped to fourth place with 204 points as he suffered from two first round loses in races 3 & 4.

Less than 25 points separates racers in fifth through tenth place, including Shannon Chennault, (197); John Richardson, (196); Shawn Langdon, (186); Jeff Derencin (185); Bobby Dye Jr., (185); and Jeff Murdock, (174).
